We are proud to present the 2022-23 Governors Annual Report to Parents.

Teaching staff at Blackwood Primary have continued to deliver excellent progress on developing Blackwood Primary's Inspire curriculum, ensuring that it fully meets the needs of all pupils. Further improvements to the pupils' learning environment have continued throughout the year with extra flower and vegetable planting areas at the front of the school and a wonderful transformation of the forest school area at the bottom of the school yard. The school continues to deliver as a Regional Lead Pioneer school, working hard to lead the way in embedding the new Curriculum for Wales. We also continued to welcome students from Cardiff Metropolitan University in our role as Lead School. In March of this year the School had a very successful visit from Education Advisory Services where they conducted a Celebrate, Support, Share, Refine visit to the school. Feedback was extremely positive and the team were impressed by the confidence of Blackwood Primary Learners and the pride that they have in their school environment.

It has been wonderful to see parents back at school for a full programme of book looks, parent consultations, family/community workshops, sports day and PTA events. Next year we will be working hard with the school to improve communication with parent, carers and the community. You will have already received some information about the parent/carers forum to be introduced in September and we look forward to working with you all on that.

We ended the year with an absolutely fantastic school fete, the first in a long time at Blackwood Primary. We would like to extend a huge thank you to Friends at Blackwood for all the hard work and dedication that went into making it such a successful event. It was wonderful to see so many smiling faces around the school. The fete included some fantastic sale and game stalls, a bouncy castle, ice cream van and a visit from the Police and Fire Service. All money raised will go toward creating more exciting events at Blackwood primary and towards improving the learning environment for all children.

# **School information**

Blackwood Primary is a local authority maintained primary school within Caerphilly County Borough Council and the school sits within the Islwyn region, working in a cluster with Blackwood Comprehensive School and five other primary schools – Cefn Fforest, Fleur-de-Lys Primary, Libanus, Markham and Pengam. At Blackwood Primary school we share a commitment to the development of the whole child. Our total class count of pupils, as at 30th April 2023, was 416, which includes nursery provision. For the 22-23 academic year, Blackwood Primary School had 15 classes and has a two-form entry (Nursery Am and PM are counted as one class). Nearly all children come from non-Welsh speaking families and, as at 30 April 2023, 4.40% of pupils used English as an additional language. 34% of our children were eligible for free school meals (Y1-Y6). Pupils with Additional Learning Needs (ALN) have their needs met through either universal or targeted support in line with the new Welsh Government ALN Act.

We pride ourselves on being an inclusive primary school family, supporting and encouraging all our staff and pupils to achieve their potential. We ensure all stakeholders have a voice in decision making and have the opportunity to improve all aspects of school life. We aim to ensure that everyone has the same chances and opportunities irrespective of race, sex, religion or belief, sexual orientation, class or disability. We believe that by working together and consulting with all our stakeholders, everyone feels valued and included - a key factor for school improvement. Our school mission statement continues to be 'United we, Empower, Nurture and Challenge, Wrth uno mae'n ein arfogi i feithrin a herio.' We strive in all aspects of school life to be a continuous, self-improving learning community, aiming for excellence in all we do.

# Curriculum

Blackwood Primary is leading the way on the roll out of the New Curriculum for Wales. In October 2023 in person events were held at school on the INSPIRE curriculum, as part of the 'Meet the Teacher' days. Blackwood Primary's INSPIRE curriculum has been designed with the involvement of all key stakeholders. The four purposes are fully reflected in the design to ensure that our learners are ambitious, enterprising, ethical and healthy citizens. Health and wellbeing is a priority and learning environments at our school have been designed with this in mind. #### **Inset Days**

As outlined in the <u>National Professional Learning Entitlement</u>, Blackwood Primary School support the professional learning of all staff to further develop reflective, enquiring and collaborative education professionals and a culture of mutual responsibility in relation to professional learning. Time allocated to INSET is used effectively to develop staff within the context of <u>schools as learning organisations</u>.



The INSET sessions at Blackwood Primary School may take place on the school premises, off site via a variety of online mediums, or using prior worked Twilight sessions. Professional learning for staff is linked to school priorities as detailed in the school development plan as well as covering the mandatory training required.

INSET sessions in 2022/2023 focused on the development of the Curriculum for Wales through our INSPIRE curriculum and self evaluation processes, further work towards the ALN reform and well being and equity procedures and practices.

# **Our Governing Body and Terms of Office**

The Governing Body and the Headteacher share responsibility for the strategic management of the school. Whilst the Governing Body provides strategic leadership, challenge, and support, the Headteacher is responsible for internal organisation, management, and control of the school. The full Governing Body meets at least once a term, usually more frequently. In addition, sub-committees meet to discuss specific issues and report back to the Governing Body on a regular basis. School and LA policies are reviewed by the Governing Body each term on a rolling basis.

#### **Governor Interaction**

This year, our governors have been hands on in school through a variety of activities including class talks, Assemblies, Concerts and STEM activities. Here are some examples from Heulwen, Andy and Richard.

#### Heulwen:

As part of my role as a governor in this school I was delighted to visit year 4 children in the Autumn term. At a previous governor meeting I'd noticed they had been researching the word "Advent", and what it meant. So, I was delighted to come along and bring a large model of a Christingle Orange to share with them the story of what a Christingle service is all about. They were brilliant – they knew so much! Recently I was in again to take assemblies for reception to year 2 and year 3 to 6. Different time of year, different theme, now it was all about the world they lived in and caring for all around. This time I told them the story of the star fish (Sea Star) and although as individuals we don't think we can make a difference to our world, if we all work together, we can.

You can be assured that children of this school are the BEST! - (as a previous teacher of this school, I might be biased.)

#### Andy:

I became a new Governor in 2023, but before I was appointed I was asked as the new minister at Mount Pleasant Baptist Church, Blackwood, to take the Harvest assembly. It was a full school hall with loads of food brought to support the local food bank. The children had learned poems and songs, which were awesome! I was able to watch the enthusiastic singing, and then I brought about 10 children to the front.

I divided a large water melon, very unequally between these children. One small child received a full half of the melon and the biggest boy had just a morsel. The faces revealed the unfairness of the 'sharing' and children were rightly cross.

I used the illustration to talk about the poverty and unfairness of world wealth and food distribution, and about how the richer nations take far more than the fair share of the world's harvest.



I was also pleased to host the children at our church for the Christmas concerts which were very well attended and full of great songs – ancient and modern.



Richard:

Our STEM link governor held a session with Year 6 pupils in November linking engineering and science to the topic of materials and matter that the pupils were studying. States of matter were explored and discussed with hands on examples of solids, liquids and gases with children literally bouncing off the walls acting as gas. How materials change from one state to another were discussed with reference to boiling, freezing and melting. Elastic, plastic and natural materials were examined and the processes involved to improve material properties.

Groups then undertook a final experiment involving solids (plastic bottle), liquids (oil, food colouring and water) and a gas (utilising a vitamin tablet) to create lava lamps. Pupils found out that oil and water don't mix and water is more dense than oil, thus keeping the oil on top. They then witnessed the vitamin tablet change from a solid to a gas through a chemical reaction with the water with the bubbles floating up through the oil as they are less dense. The real-life properties of density were discussed with examples given of floats helping people swim. Where appropriate, this was further explored into engineering uses, such as dense concrete in marine environments to anchor things like wind turbines to the seabed.









#### **School Attendance**

Attendance remains a school priority. We have a full time Family Liaison Officer who focuses on prioritising attendance levels within school, working in collaboration with the Headteacher, Wellbeing lead and the Local Authority Education Welfare Officer. The Governing Body reviews attendance throughout the year and is pleased to see the active role that pupil leadership take to contribute towards this priority.

# Welsh Language Provision Datblygu'r Iaith Cymraeg

Blackwood Primary is committed to improving the Welsh used within school. The Criw Cymraeg meet on a regular basis to support us in this aim. Once again they helped to make this year's St David's Day / Dydd Gwyl Dewi celebrations a success, where certificates were awarded for challenges set in different categories such as cooking and creative tasks. The Criw Cymraeg wrote the school prayer this year and taught us all through weekly assemblies. They also gave us phrases to learn and use incidentally. All year groups have a 'Cwtsh Cymraeg' where Welsh books, magazines, dictionaries, language mats and activities are incorporated to make Welsh learning fun.

# Healthy Eating, Drinking and Living

Blackwood Primary works hard to promote the importance of good nutrition and healthy eating and drinking. Pupils are asked to bring only healthy food and drink into school and water and milk is readily available to all pupils throughout the day. A daily healthy snack is available for a small fee of £1 per week and all pupils are encouraged to take up the offer of Free School Meals which is available for all year groups at Blackwood Primary from September 2024.

Heathy living is embedded within Blackwood's Inspire curriculum, for example, vegetable growing in the school allotments, nutritious cooking activities, forest school, outdoor learning, weekly PE sessions and cycle safety training. A range of extra-curricular activities that promote healthy living are also on offer to all pupils, such as after school cookery clubs, a wide range of sporting clubs and tournament opportunities that are available throughout the school year.

# **Extra-curricular clubs**

Extra-curricular clubs were back in full swing this academic year and it has been lovely to see the range of extra-curricular activities available to the pupils, from Cooking to Lego and STEM to Yoga. Taekwando, Football and multi-sports were also delivered by external agencies. The Governing Body would like to extend a big thank you to the school for their work in offering these opportunities which help to stimulate pupils learning and improve social skills.


