Nursery / Meithrin

A super half term has been had by all in Nursery. Our Jubilee celebrations were a success and lots of fun had by all. Creating a 3D cake for the King using a 2 colour repeating pattern, building a castle with the blocks, matching numbers of the guards lots of maths skills have been used.

A very special delivery arrived which had everyone excited. 10 tiny caterpillars !

We have watched them grow and grow and then spin a cocoon. All 10 are now sleeping and getting ready to change into a butterfly. This has got us very interested in the lifecycle of a butterfly and have been investigating the process. We have continued to strengthen the muscles in our hands with clay and play dough rolling, squeezing, pushing and pulling to

create our own butterfly life cycles. In the Creative area we have been observing and drawing the caterpillars and cocoons beginning to describe how they look. Lots of colourful creations have been painted whilst learning about the symmetry and pattern of a butterfly.

Our story this term has been The very hungry caterpillar we have followed the days of the week and tasted all of the lovely fruits the hungry caterpillar ate.

Year 5 / Blwyddyn 5

Wow! What a busy half-term it's been. We have worked our socks off and we are super proud of the progress and achievements of our children. Da iawn everyone!

The King's Coronation was celebrated throughout the school! We covered a range of activities including portraits, using Google Earth to calculate and compare the distances between the 1953 and 2023, created reports, plotted coordinates of famous landmarks along the Coronation route and learned a huge amount through our research.

In English we have been writing discussion texts about whether physical education is an important part of the curriculum. In Numeracy we cover 3D shape, symmetry, coordinates across 4 quadrants, converting units of measure, subtracting numbers using column method and collecting data to answer possessed questions.

Our allotment is really taking shape! We have been lucky to receive a donation of plants from a Year 5 parent which gives us a flying start! We prepped the soil first, used our knowledge of coordinates to create a grid and then planned where to plant our seeds and plants. We are looking after them daily by watering and removing any weeds, we look forward to keeping you posted on the progress.

Were delighted to welcome Paralympic swimmer Rhiannon Henry to school, as part of 'Sports for Schools'. We were well and truly put through our paces and as you can from the pictures on twitter we had a great time!
