#### **NURSERY**


#### **MEITHRIN**

#### **BLYDDWYN PEDWAR**

As we reach the end of another exciting school year, we are delighted to share with you the wonderful achievements and activities that Year 4 have completed during the last term.

In our maths lessons, the children have explored coordinates, rotations and directional language.

They have developed a strong understanding of how to read and plot points on a grid, which has been both challenging and fun. We have also been identifying fractions, calculating fractions of amounts and identifying types of angles.

Our literacy sessions have been particularly exciting as pupils have been working on writing an alternative narrative of the classic tale, Little Red Riding Hood. To inspire their creativity, we took a memorable trip to the secret garden. Here, pupils used their senses to describe the setting, which enriched their stories with vivid and imaginative details. In addition to setting descriptions, we focused on the use of dialogue in storytelling. Pupils learned how to effectively incorporate speech into their narratives, bringing their characters to life and adding depth to their stories.

Furthermore, pupils have also worked on writing persuasive leaflets to encourage readers to visit the Bristol Zoo Project. To achieve this, they explored persuasive language techniques, including the use of superlative adjectives, and examined the key features of a leaflet. Their final leaflets were both informative and compelling.

In our humanities lessons, we embarked on a virtual journey to France. The children have been locating various places on a map of France, learning about different regions and their significance. Additionally, we have been exchanging letters with our partner school in France. The pupils wrote detailed letters describing our school and even taught our French friends how to play traditional games for their playground. This cultural exchange has been both educational and enjoyable for everyone involved. A big thank you to the British Council!

Our DCF lessons have been equally engaging, with the children exploring the fundamentals of Scratch programming. They discovered what each block does in the game and learned how to use these blocks to create their own simple programs.

Additionally, as part of our "Our Wonderful World" theme, pupils had the delightful experience of cooking pizzas this term. This activity allowed them to learn about different ingredients, follow a recipe, and enjoy the delicious results of their hard work.

Our end of year trip to Folly Farm was a huge success. During this trip, pupils had the opportunity to see a wide variety of animals and learn about the importance of protecting their habitats as part of our topic.

#### **BLYDDWYN PUMP**

As part of our Inspire learning during the summer term, we have been learning all about 'Byd Bendigedig', Our Wonderful World. We started this theme by investigating the 7 wonders of the ancient world and where they were located. Using our numeracy skills, we investigated the height, perimeter and area of different landmarks across the world! Using our literacy skills, we used our persuasive writing skills to create tourist information leaflets to visit countries where there is a wonder of the world. We found the Great Pyramid of Giza to be of interest as it is the only Wonder of the ancient world still standing. We used the pyramid to write vivid descriptions that would be used to create our own horror stories based in the pyramid. We wondered how the pyramids were built and some of the amazing secrets they might hide.

Applying our literacy skills across the curriculum again, we wrote authentic newspaper articles about some of the most recent discoveries that had been made. With all the knowledge we gained we questioned how the treasure of burial chambers might have been kept safe and secure. Using technology, we managed to create sensors using the BBC Micro Bits so that when some steps on a pressure plate (made from cardboard and foil) an intruder alarm is triggered. In science and technology, we wanted to be able to create automated water devices to keep our allotments water over the summer months. We used the BBC Micro Bits to create soil moisture sensors so that we could investigate when soil is low in moisture and so needs watering.

Using our understanding of the 7 wonders of the world we researched the most significant wonders of Wales to create our own list. From this we created an iMovie to promote our 7 wonders of Wales!

Everyone who attended had a fantastic time at PGL! We shared some fantastic times and learned all about teamwork, communication, resilience, perseverance as well as many life skills that will help as we move into Year 6 and 7.
