As we reach the end of another wonderful school year, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on all that we've accomplished together. What a fantastic year it has been! From exciting classroom activities to memorable school events, our pupils have continued to inspire us with their enthusiasm, hard work, and kindness.

On a personal note, I want to sincerely thank each and every one of you for your kind support throughout the year. It is a pleasure to work alongside such dedicated parents and carers, and your involvement truly enhances the nurturing environment we aim to create here at Blackwood Primary School.

This year, we welcomed many visitors to the school, including Estyn, who conducted a thorough review of our processes and practices. We are eagerly awaiting the release of their report, which will be published on the **4th of August**. Please keep an eye out for it, and we'll ensure that you're kept informed of any updates. I'm incredibly proud of our pupils, who were fantastic throughout the process, showcasing their skills and maturity in every interaction. They continue to make us all proud day after day.

Looking ahead to next year, I'm pleased to share that our transition plans have been a success. In consultation with our Governors, we will have a mixed year 1/2 year group where learners will access our highly effective learning provision both inside and outside, daily, through our Inspire Curriculum. Learners will be split into 3 mixed classes with a lead teacher for registration, parent consultation and a main point of contact. The curriculum in Wales is designed to allow flexibility, meaning pupils from different year groups can be taught together while ensuring that each child's individual needs are met.

At Blackwood Primary School, we ensure high standards of teaching and learning to enable all groups of learners to make progress. Pupils work in family groups within their year group, which are reviewed and refined as a result of regular assessment and analysis of progress. Each family group engages in a blend of teaching approaches daily. We understand that change can be unsettling and raise concerns, particularly when it comes to classroom dynamics and how it may impact the learning experience. However, I want to reassure you that this approach is not new to our school.

We have successfully implemented mixed-year teaching in other areas, and we believe this will be an effective way to continue supporting the diverse needs of our pupils. As we move forward with this plan, we remain committed to ensuring that all teaching is tailored to each child's needs, with the necessary support in place to help them thrive.

In numeracy, we learnt many new concepts. Collecting and interpreting data helped us work independently, and we also practised times tables, division, telling the time, measuring, and weighing using a variety of tools. Using Mathletics has been great fun and helped us develop our problem-solving skills.

We had an amazing time on sports day – a big thank you to Mr Grandin for organising this special event! We're looking forward to our Year 3 adventure. Our recent transition days showed just how independent we have become with our learning. It's been a busy and fun-packed year!

YEAR 3/4

BLYDDWYN TRI/PEDWAR

What a fantastic summer term we've had! As part of our exciting theme 'Byd Bendigedig' (Wonderful World), we've been exploring the big question: 'Where Does Our Produce Come From?' Through engaging, hands-on learning and thought-provoking discussions, pupils have deepened their understanding of the world around them, with a particular focus on food origins, sustainability, and environmental impact.

We started the term with 'pupil voice', giving our learners the opportunity to shape their own learning journey. Their enthusiasm and curiosity helped guide our planning and made this term all the more meaningful.

In Literacy this term, our learning has been both creative and purposeful. We began by using body biographies to help us ask and answer thoughtful questions about key characters, deepening our comprehension skills. We then moved on to writing a film review and an emotive diary entry inspired by The Dreamgiver, where pupils demonstrated empathy and imagination. Alongside this, we enjoyed designing our own wanted posters, incorporating compound and complex sentences to build detail and suspense. We also focused on using similes effectively, adding vivid imagery and description to our writing.

In Maths, we have developed a range of important skills through engaging, real-world contexts. Pupils explored capacity and volume, learning to measure and convert between units accurately. We also delved into the concept of profit and loss, applying all four operations to solve problems linked to everyday situations. Our geometry work included identifying properties of both 2D and 3D shapes and investigating lines of symmetry, which supported our cross-curricular art projects. Finally, we revisited fractions, strengthening our understanding and applying this knowledge in different problem-solving scenarios.

Our INSPIRE curriculum has been full of hands-on learning and creative exploration. Pupils began by writing persuasive letters to the PTA, requesting seeds to plant in our allotment areas—an initiative that helped connect our learning to the local community. In science, we carried out an investigation to discover which conditions best support plant growth, encouraging curiosity and teamwork. We created artwork inspired by William Morris, using lines of symmetry, and explored the work of Paul Cézanne, producing still-life pieces that celebrated the beauty of produce and nature. We also discussed the benefits of buying local produce compared to importing goods, linking our learning to sustainability and environmental awareness. We also reflected on the story of Adam and Eve and discussed how it connects to our school value of the month: Respect. Throughout the term, pupils have continued to use our authentic learning areas to develop their independence and apply skills in meaningful ways.

Our authentic learning areas have continued to offer pupils the chance to develop their skills independently, encouraging creativity, problem-solving and resilience.

We also enjoyed a brilliant workshop by Dor Cymru, where we learned all about water efficiency and how small changes in our homes can help us be smarter with water – a vital resource for our planet.

One of the highlights of our summer term was our fantastic Sports Day! It was wonderful to see so much encouragement, teamwork and determination from all year groups. A huge thank you to all the families who came to support—it made the day even more special. Well done to all the children for their enthusiasm and effort... and congratulations to all of our pupils for participating.

Our sporting success doesn't end there, as many of our pupils have taken part in bowls and tennis finals throughout the summer term. Our tennis team went all the way to the final and proudly came away with the gold medal! Da iawn to everyone for their fantastic sporting achievements.

As always, we're incredibly proud of how hard the children have worked and how much they've grown – not only academically, but in confidence and independence too. Thank you for your continued support throughout the term.

YEAR 5

BLYDDWYN PUMP


During the Summer term, our Byd Bendigedig theme focus in Year 5 was "Has Technology made our World better?" We started this theme using our pupil influence to generate ideas on what we would like to find out, with our end goal to create an iMovie/presentation to teach younger children about this issue. Through our literacy work we have been exploring science fiction narratives inspired by the futuristic world of Pandora, and creating poems based on fictional creatures like the Jabberwocky.

Through our INSPIRE learning, we have explored the history of technology, finding out some of the key figures from society who have shaped our technological world, while researching the advantages and disadvantages of some of the forms of technology we use today. We have also investigated the use of Artificial Technology, using it to generate recipes in the cooking area based on our pantry ingredients. In addition, we have been exploring machine learning by creating our own 'boxerbit' device, programming a microbit to recognise different movements and reaction times based on our different movements. We have also taken part in workshops using machine learning and AI to generate images based on our descriptive language skills.

During this term we have also enjoyed our fantastic four day residential to Hilston Park, along with developing our water safety skills through swimming lessons at our local leisure centre in Cefn Fforest. While it has been a very busy term, we have developed many life skills including measuring and engineering, as we created wooden digital device holders and fabric pouches in our woodwork and sewing areas. We have also used Minecraft education to plan our own futuristic buildings using different materials/blocks before attempting to bring them to life using the Kapla construction blocks. Our theme was brought to an end with a sharing event in class where we watched our completed iMovies among our peers before sharing them with pupils lower down the school.

As usual, thank you to all parents/careers for the continued support from the Year 5 team. Have a great summer holiday and we wish all of Year 5 the very best for their final year in Blackwood Primary.











Our Summer Term theme was Byd Bendigedig and our authentic question was 'How is the land used for leisure?' We began the term with a visit to Blackwood Market Square where we interviewed residents to find out what they like about Blackwood and what improvements could be made. We used this information to create a tally and a graph. In science we learnt about the life cycle of a plant and labelled all the different parts. We celebrated VE Day and created some really effective artwork. We analysed data about WW2 and made comparisons.

We then began a really exciting theme park project, working in groups to design a new theme park in a remote country. This project allowed us to have different roles such as publishing, accounts and eco managers. We were really creative in our designs and we loved filming promotional adverts to launch our parks.

We welcomed many visitors to school this term including local artist David Chamberlain and Gwent Police Cyber Prevention Unit. We also had lots of transition events with Blackwood Comprehensive School.

We discovered that many butterflies are in decline and decided to help them by planting a beautiful butterfly garden researching which plants attract most butterflies.

We really enjoyed our trip to Oxford University. This gave us the opportunity to have a mini-lecture, eat lunch in the Grand Hall and have a tour of Oxford. It was really inspirational! We also enjoyed our final Primary Sports Day, particularly watching our mams and dads doing the egg and spoon race!

The term ended with our Leavers events - a concert and a party with a Hawaiian theme!

Wow Year 6, what an amazing last year in Primary School you have all had! You have been really fantastic this year and we are so proud of each and every one of you.
