

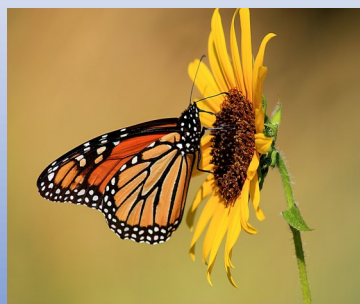

Absences

As a school we are striving to increase our overall attendance moving forward and cannot do this without your support.

Lateness

We have a significant number of children who are continually late attending school.

Please try to ensure that your child arrives at school so that they are present for registration;
this is marked at 9.00 am each day.

Important interventions are carried out first thing every day and if your child is late it means they are missing an important part of their learning. Lateness causes problems over lunch money/numbers, register marking and missed instructions.

Where a genuine reason for lateness exists this will be an authorised absence but where explanations are inadequate or the lateness is after 9.10 am.

Year 2 / Blwydden 2

Year 2 has enjoyed completing lots of challenges connected with our authentic learning goal; 'Where the River Meets the Sea'. We've looked at local rivers and how they connect to the sea, created reports, explored habitats and much more! When writing non-chronological reports we used text and images to add lots of detail; we also underlined titles and provided QR codes for others to access additional information.

When researching facts about Salmon fish we recorded the facts we found using digital mind maps.

We continue to work on our problem-solving skills during Maths Box sessions; we've looked at time, shape, and pattern and explored different standardised measures.

We all loved coming together as a School to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We researched facts about the Queen and took a virtual tour of Buckingham Palace. While we were together on the yard we celebrated by singing songs, dancing and eating our Jubilee lunch.

We look forward to the rest of the Summer Term; we cannot wait for Sports Day and opportunities to visit year three! We'll continue to develop our skills and cannot wait to create art inspired by the coast.

Year 3 / Blwydden 3

Year 3 have been having a great summer term so far this year and a real highlight was all of our Platinum Jubilee celebrations before the half term holiday. We made decorations and baked our own cakes to enjoy at a whole school picnic on the yard. We sang songs and listened to performances from the other year groups and even had our faces painted!



This term we have been learning about rainforests and the devastating effects deforestation can have on this beautiful habitat. We kicked off the term with a visit from Animal Lab where the children were lucky enough to come close to some animals you may find in the rainforest. We were blown away with how brave the children were and so many were happy to hold a snake!

We have been learning about a whole host of things to do with the rainforest from the different layers of the rainforest, the creatures you may find and how the demand for palm oil is destroying so much of the natural habitat. We have been using our ICT skills to create branching databases and graphs to show some of our findings. We have loved getting creative and creating tribal headdresses inspired by some of the tribes living within rainforests.

The children had the opportunity to be engineers for the day when Mr Wilks visited and got to collaborate on a STEM project together. We are in the process of writing our own 'Kennings' style poems about Rainforest animals using the information learnt in the Summer term so far.



This term we have been lucky enough to welcome Miss Webber via TEAMS, all the way from Switzerland. She has been teaching the children German, reading traditional tales and teaching us about her own culture. Just a reminder that Year 3 reading books need to be returned by a Friday each week and new books will be given on a Monday to go home.

Year 4 / Blwydden 4

Year 4 have had a very busy term so far! We began this term's theme of Rivers and Oceans by taking a walk to our local Sirhowy River.

We were brilliant detectives and found lots of the features of rivers. We found some river wildlife, skimmed pebbles and sketched what we could see. We have also been lucky enough to travel to Cardiff to visit Techniquest! The exhibitions were absolutely amazing and to finish off a fabulous visit, we went to a workshop all about animals and their habitats. Some of us (including some of the teachers) were invited to join in some challenges - the teachers think they may have been set up?!



We interrupted our Rivers and Oceans work to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee. We learned about Queen Elizabeth II and made our own slide shows full of facts about her and the royal family. We made crowns, bunting, decorated cakes and biscuits and learned songs to sing on our day of celebrations. We have been writing poetry with a river theme and have now started our English journey where we will be writing a story based on the wordless book called Flotsam.

We have been developing our mental maths skills as well as focussing on the four operations, time, timetables and money! We have been using the Robots and Spheros to develop our coding skills and we can use ICT to collect data and construct graphs. The kitchen has been busy with us making delicious sea creature biscuits!

We have been using Commando Joes activities to develop our teamwork skills and practising athletics in PE. We are looking forward to seeing you at our Sports Day event this year!



Year 5 / Blwydden 5

What an exciting term, we have been enjoying the fine summer weather so far this term! The Queen's Jubilee proved to be an awesome day! It is the first time in a long time since we have all got together as a school, in person to celebrate. All the classes put on an amazing display and we worked incredibly hard to produce our own dance and poem. The Year 5 Team were massively proud of the children for taking ownership of the celebrations and collaborating as a whole Year group.

This term we have been exploring deforestation and its devastating effects. We are looking at the effects of deforestation in our local area compared to the Amazon rainforest. We have discovered that different countries manage their Forest Resources in very different ways. Using different information sources we looked at the pros and cons of deforestation, formulating and justifying our own opinions, in preparation for a debate. Our next step is to plan and record our challenging conversations using Flipgrid. As part of our literacy journey we have loved exploring Kensuke's Kingdom. After collecting pupil voice ideas, we used Kensuke's Kingdom as a stimulus to write an adventure story where endangered Orangutans are being threatened by illegal deforestation in the rainforest.

We have loved developing our coding skills using the BBC MicroBites and Minecraft. We used the BBC Microbits to code a pedometer, developing our debugging skills to solve problems in our code. Then we used our Maths skills to estimate how many steps it would take to walk a mile. We broke the problem down using the pedometer to measure a smaller distance, then scaled up to full distance. We love Minecraft, using the block code we have managed to make it rain cats and dogs,

Our cooking area has been turned into the 'Rainforest Cafe'! Our makeshift Pizzeria is turning out not just any Pizza but only the finest handcrafted dough this side of Italy! We are running our Rainforest cafe as an enterprise, designing, costing, creating and selling our pizza with the goal of making a profit. Stay tuned and follow our progress on Twitter.
